I have lived in Havant for over 30 years. When I moved here in 1992, Havant had been the hub of manufacturing with IBM, Kenwood, Goodmans, Colt, Wyeth and others offering employment and opportunities for many of us.

The Meridian Centre had not long been built, the cinema closed to be replaced with homes and over the years we've lost many pubs and great shops.

Leigh Park has an amazing history, the Oak trees in Wakeford's Copse were planted in around 1800

to help replace those felled for shipbuilding and named after George Wakeford, an estate tenant.

Havant Thicket is noted as far back as the 11th century, now being torn apart for the reservoir with intentions to mix 'recycled water' with spring water. Humans are creatures of habit and don't like change so this 'Water for Life' project is a big deal to us.

Change is inevitable, but changes shouldn't be without proper local consultation and representation. The service we receive from our Council should match our expectation for quality, value for money and integrity. I'm not convinced we always get this and suspect you may feel the same.
